

DO NOT SEND ANY DOCUMENTS TO THE CONSULAR SECTION

Checklist for Immigrant Visa interview

Please bring all the items listed below where applicable. One set of documents is required for **each applicant**. All documents not in English, Ukrainian, or Russian need a certified translation into English. Detailed information is available at <https://ua.usembassy.gov/visas/immigrant-visas/> .

- 1. Passport/child's passport registered with TMM courier service for delivery.
- 2. Two photographs 5x5 cm taken in the last six months **cropped and signed in English** (first and last name).
- 3. Medical examination.
- 4. Birth certificate.
- 5. Marriage certificate(s) or name change certificate(s).
- 6. Divorce certificate(s).
- 7. Death certificate(s).
- 8. Police certificate(s) listing **all names ever used**, including maiden and married names. Applicants aged 16 years and older must submit a police certificate from the country of nationality and the country of residence at the time of visa application, if the applicant has resided there for 6 months or more. Police certificates are also required from all other countries where the immigrant visa applicant has resided for one year or more after the age of 16 including the republics of the former USSR. Originals only. Include court and police records if ever arrested, detained or convicted of a crime (even if expunged) as well as translations. Police Certificates from Ukraine should be "FULL" («ПОВНА»), not "SHORT" («СКОРОЧЕНА»).
- 9. Military records.
- 10. Adoption decree.
- 11. The custody status of all applicants' children will be reviewed. Applicants need to bring all documents related to the birth, adoption, and parental rights including permission to travel of the other parent is not accompanying them. The Ukrainian government has certain requirements for children under 16 years old traveling outside of Ukraine. You may contact the Ukrainian Border Control to find out more about the requirements applicable to your specific situation.
- 12. Evidence of relationship with your spouse – written correspondence, photographs, phone records, skype logs, travels etc. (for spousal visa categories only: IR1, CR1, F21).
- 13. Affidavit of Support I- I-864 with the most recent IRS tax transcript and W-2.
- 14. Confirmation page for DS-260 online application form.
- 15. Immigrant visa fee if not paid in the U.S. prior to the interview.
- 16. All documents explaining extended stays in the U.S., including deportation documentation – originals only.

Please be advised that **no advance assurance can be given as to when or whether a visa will be issued. You should NOT give up your job, dispose of your property, or make any final travel arrangements until you receive your passport with the visa.**
